

FNNBOA BUILDING CODE INSPECTION PROGRAM

FNNBOA offers a certification process for Housing Inspection which includes the following to become a Level 2: FNBO (First Nation Building Officer) and/or Level 1: FNBI (First Nation Building Inspector), recognized by FNNBOA the following is required:

1. Completion of the FNBO Program Requirements (listed below)
2. Completion of the National Examinations for the 3 NBC Building Code courses
3. Completion of a two (2) years of verified practical/mentored work experience
4. Agreement to abide by the FNNBOA Code of Ethics and Standards of Practice

In addition, to become a FNBI the individual must successfully complete the following building code courses which include a proctored exam at the end of each course:

3. MC202 NBC House (40 hours)
4. MC203 NPC Plumbing (36 hours)
5. MC204 NBC Section 9.36 Energy (32 hours)

NOTE: Successful completion of the above links to the FNBO designation. A FNBI is deemed as a House Building Inspector in training that has not completed the two (2) years of verified practical mentored work experience.
